Meeting notes RE: Wright State 2018 quilt exhibit

The overall theme will be "The Art of Woman"

Deadline for quilts is the November 2017 meeting.

The quilts can be specifically about a woman's topic, but that is not a requirement. Members are encouraged to make a piece on a topic that is personally important and create a story about the journey of making it. This can be as simple as stating the inspiration for the quilt but more is better, whatever you are comfortable sharing.

Other than the three exceptions listed below**, any subject, color, size and shape is acceptable.

You can use any of the women's topics discussed previously or anything you'd like to add. If enough quilts are submitted that follow a technique or method, they will be grouped together. If you'd like to experiment with zentangles, graffiti, photo to fabric, art to fabric, or women artists they will all be included under the umbrella of "The Art of Woman". If there are several zentangle quilts for instance, those will be hung together.

There were three subjects that had a lot of interest on the survey so those will have their own section.

There will be one section for the embroidery squares we are currently working on. Traditionally crazy quilts aren't quilted so once they are completed they can be finished off as simply as a felt back.

A second section will be set aside for 2017 Aullwood themed quilts; Stripes, Spots, and Shapes in Nature. Follow Aullwood guidelines.

There will also be a third section set aside for 2017 Grand Rapid themed quilts; Black & White and One Other Color. Follow B/W& One guidelines.

The signage for the last two sections should reflect the exhibits that inspired these quilts. The good thing is, if you are doing any of these three subjects, you'll have them done and ready for the WSU exhibit. Even if you aren't planning on entering Aullwood or Grand Rapids, you are welcome to make a quilt using their guidelines for WSU 2018.

Signage for the quilts and the possibility of a banner was discussed.

Also discussed was election of officers in June and possibly continuing Saturday sew-in's
